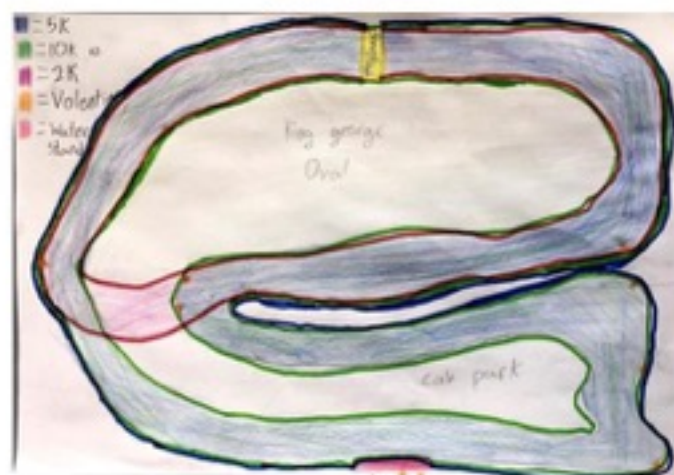

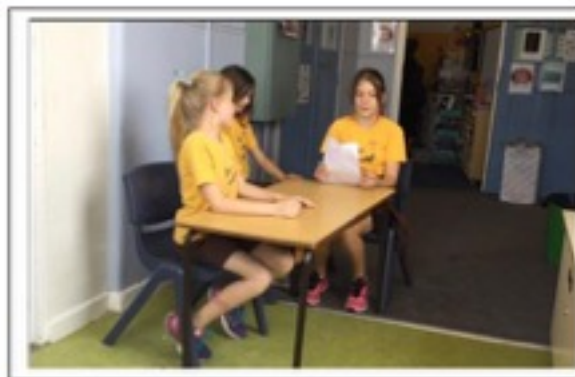

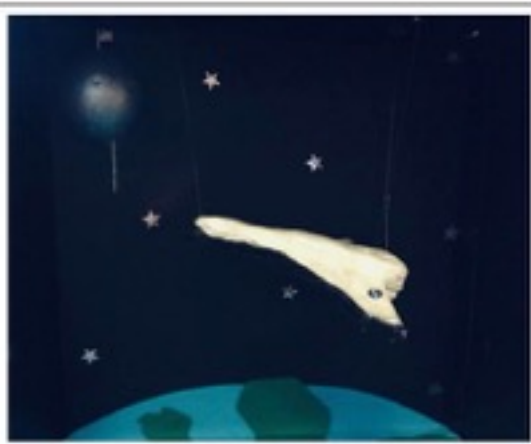
Our F2L is all about space and stars,

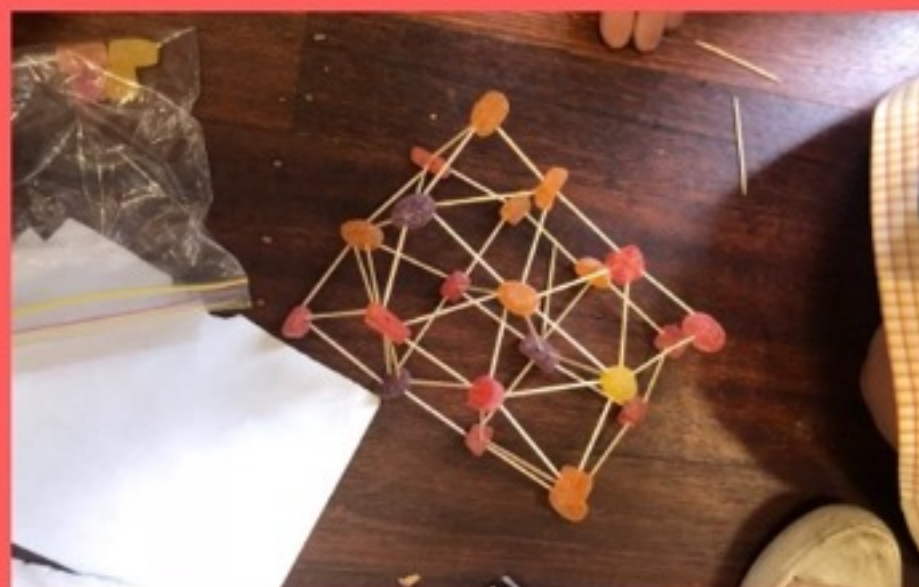


FREEDOM 2 LEARN TASK:

Thank you once again, and have a very Merry Christmas. I will be back to visit soon!

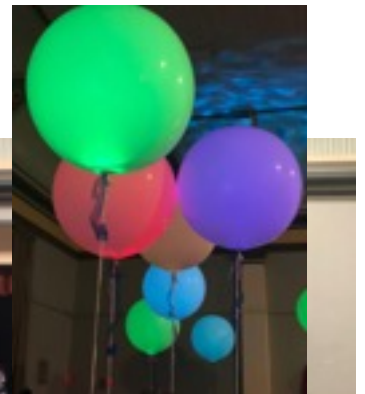
