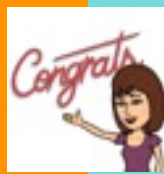

This test does not assess all of what makes each of you exceptional and unique.

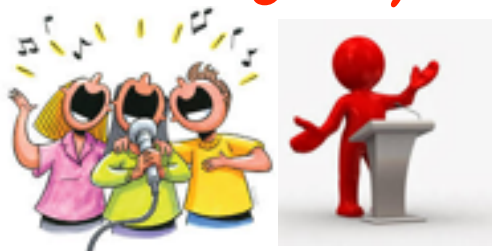
The people who score these tests don't know that some of you love to sing or play an instrument, are good at drawing, or can teach others how to use a computer program. They have not seen the way that some of you can dance with grace, or speak confidently to a large group. They do not know that your friends count on you to be there for them when they are sad. They do not know that you participate in sports, help your Mum or Dad, or that you play with your little brother, sister or cousins. They do not know that you are caring, thoughtful and that every day you do your best. because these are attributes that cannot be tested.

The scores you get from this test will tell you how you did on that day, but they will not tell you everything.

They can't tell you that you have improved on something that you once found difficult. They can't tell you that you brighten up your teacher's day. They can't tell you how amazingly special you are.

Hopefully, you tackled each NAPLAN test this week, to the best of your ability, although you need to remember

that **there is no one way to 'test' all the wonderful things that make you, YOU!**

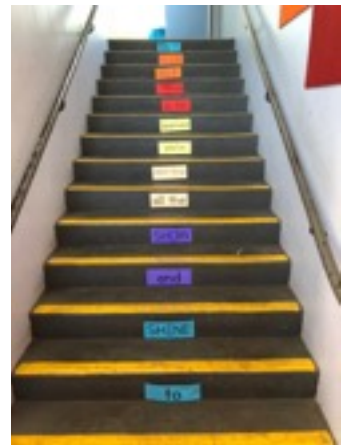


The day prior to NAPLAN commencing, each student in Year 3 received a special message and gift.

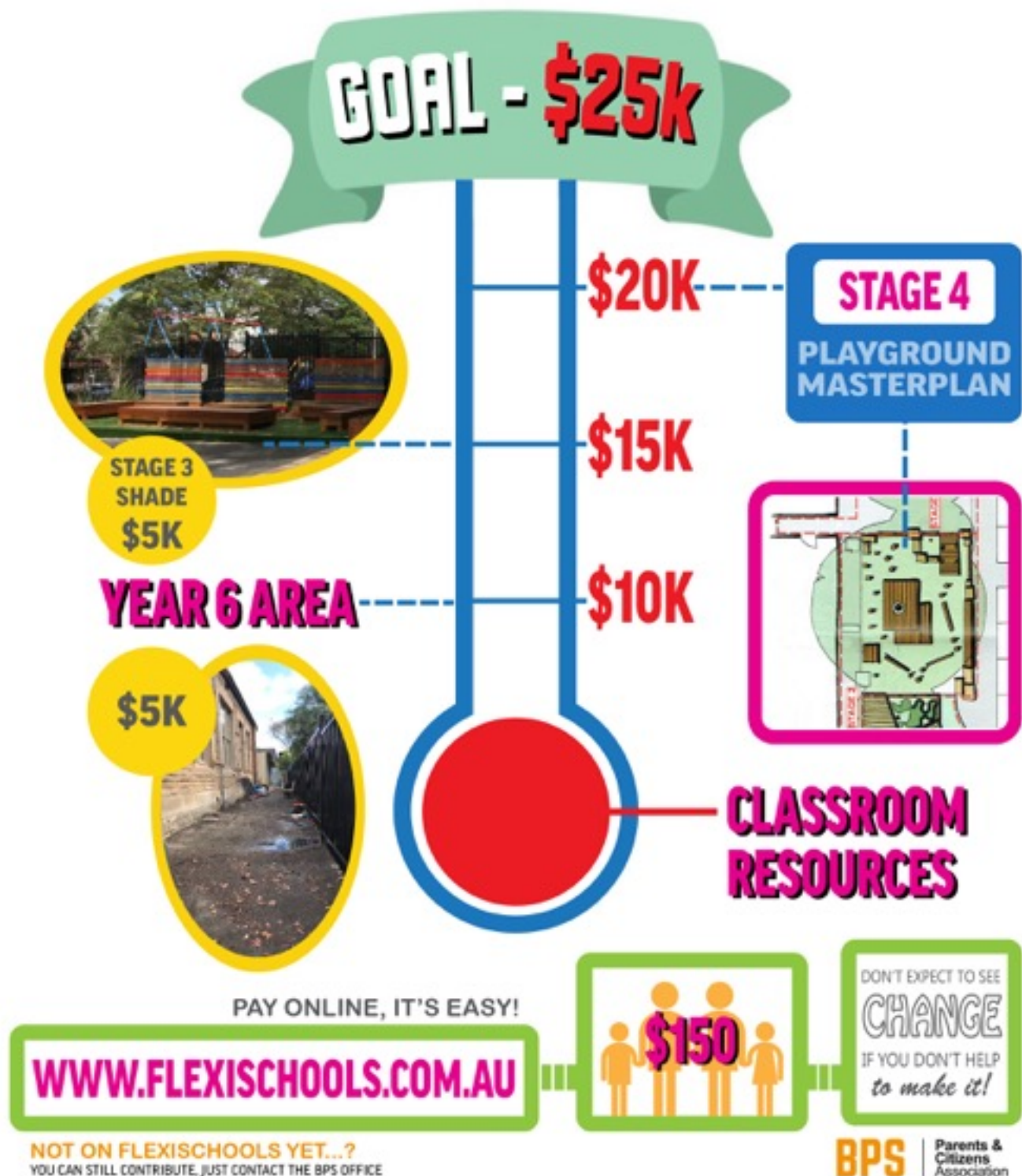

Welcome Parents and Carers to the first week of **Rock & Water**. Each week, in the newsletter will be updates of:

- What it is
- What is happening in each week
- Key words and phrases you can use with your child

This week was the inaugural week for Stage 2 students who are not involved in PSSA. On Friday afternoon, they got to spend some time with me, Mr Baumann, to begin their journey within **Rock & Water**.

## What is Rock & Water?

The **Rock & Water** program is an experience that provides young people a pathway to self-awareness, and increased self-confidence and social functioning.

Each participant of the **Rock & Water** program undergoes a journey of self-awareness as they learn about responding to life with either “rock” or a “water” attitude. The use of symbolism is central to the success of the **Rock & Water** program and a reason why students are drawn to the program.

The program is an excellent tool to support young people in finding their grounding, learning how to centre oneself and learning how to self-manage in social settings.

Topics covered in the program include:

- Intuition
- Body language
- Mental strength
- Empathic feeling
- Positive feeling
- Positive thinking
- Positive visualisation

Topics include:

- Bullying
- Life goals
- Following their inner compass.

## This Week's Focus

**Breathing Techniques** – this is great during times of stress, anger or sadness. It allows us to find our centre, stay calm, and focus on what the real issue is.

**Standing Strong** – standing strong in our “rock” stance gave us a feeling of strength. Some were surprised as to how strong we really are.

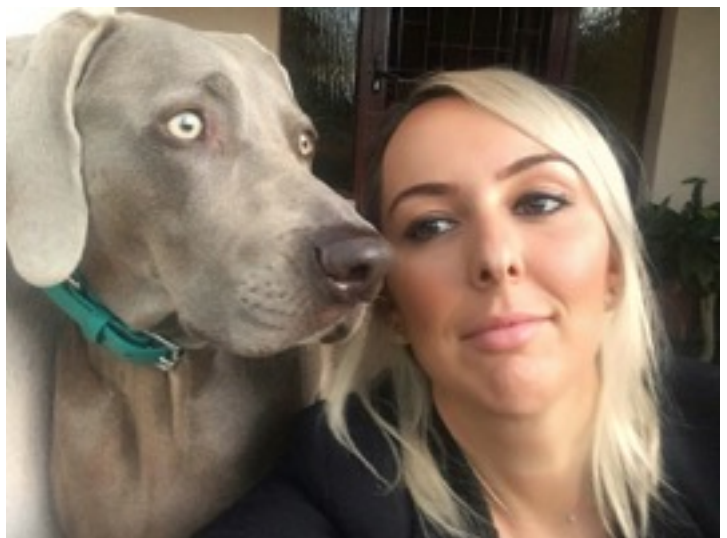

# ADHD Transitions - Moving up to High School

**Dr Caroline Stevenson**

Clinical Psychologist

ADHD children usually have difficulty with transitions. One of the most significant transitions is moving up to high school. Parents struggle deciding which high school to send their ADHD child and worry about how they will manage in this new environment.
