Every year 1,800 public school children attend our safe haven next to Curl Curl beach at no cost to their parents or carers.

During a 12 day stay they are provided with dental, optical, hearing and medical screening and treatment.

Children participate in educational programs and excursions designed to develop their social and emotional skills, build self-esteem and improve their overall well-being.

This experience provides children with a much needed break from their current circumstance. Our children are inspired to see beyond the present and to have real hope and positive aspirations for their future.

Children in the care of Stewart House attend a specific purpose school onsite for 8 days of their 12-day stay. The NSW Department of Education provides infrastructure and staffing support for this school.

All others costs associated with the children's stay are met from charitable donations.



Cost per child for their Stewart House stay:

Supervision and care = \$70 per child per day

Accommodation, food & transport = \$40 per child per day

Wellbeing & additional health care = \$20 per child per day

Total cost per day = \$130 per child

Total cost for 12 day visit = \$1560 per child

REAL-LIFE MATHS

Our **RETURN and EARN** (a scheme to encourage recycling by the NSW Government) Bin, containing drink containers, had finally reached capacity. Instead of taking it to the shop to collect 10 cents per container, Miss Pauline decided to turn the counting of the containers into a Maths lesson.

We separated the bottles, cans and poppers and counted them, putting them into rows of 10. We had 53 bottles, 35 poppers and 11 Cans. We wrote down each number 1, 2, 3... until we reached these numbers. We then made sure there were 10 in each row. We performed the repeated addition of 10 (in each row) $10 + 10 + 10 + 10 + 10$ and rediscovered the same number of bottles, poppers and cans, noting our left overs. This was followed by the process of multiplication and division.

The four Stage 1 students who performed these real life mathematical calculations made such comments-as, "Can we do this all day?", "This is so much fun!" and "I am so clever!"

The containers were then taken to a local shop where we collected \$9.50 (4 containers were rejected because they had contained milk). This money is going towards our garden.

The quicker we fill our **RETURN and EARN** Bin, the more often I can perform these Real Life Maths activities with a growing number of students and the more we earn for our garden, of course the better off is our environment. This is a WIN, WIN, WIN situation!

Please help us fill the **RETURN and EARN** Bin more often by bringing your **EMPTY, CLEAN DRINK CONTAINERS** to school and encouraging your children to deposit their containers in this bin, which is located either at the bottom of the steps near the office, or just inside the double doors leading up to the classrooms.

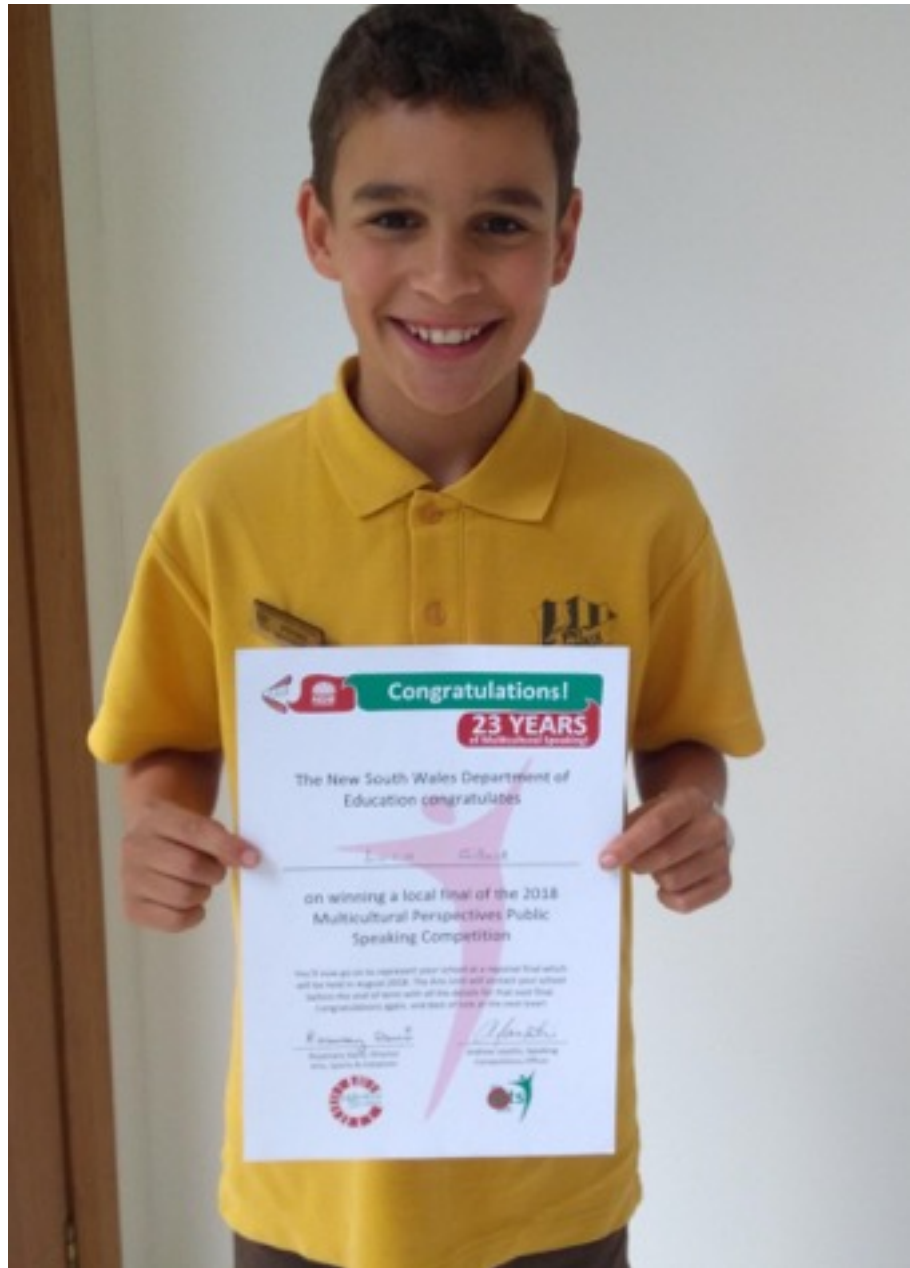


MULTICULTURAL PERSPECTIVES PUBLIC SPEAKING COMPETITION

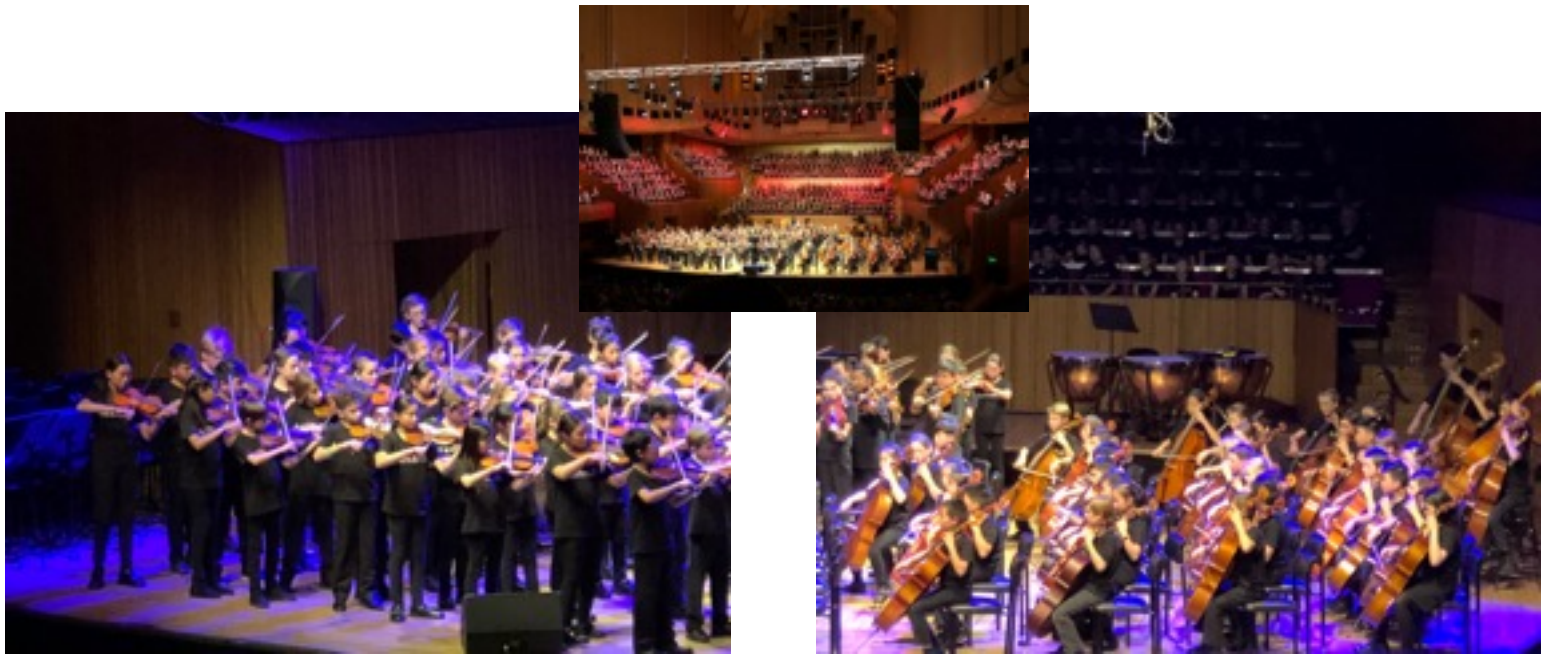

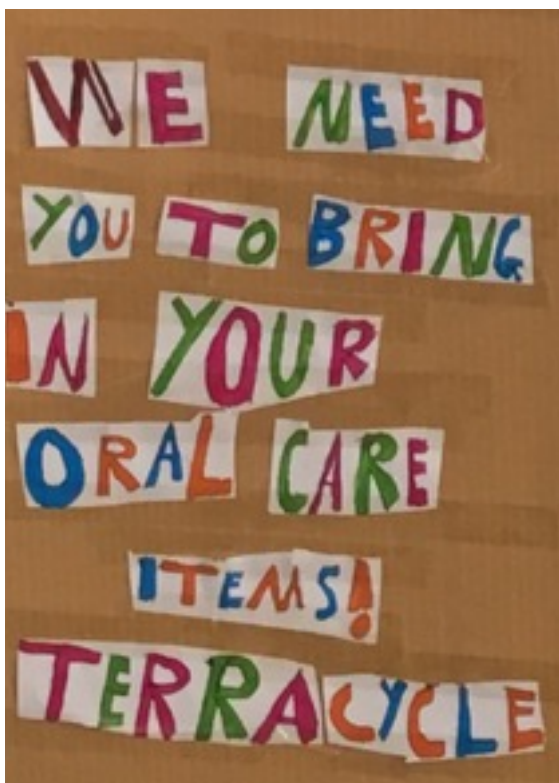
