Vale, Miss Muline

Dr Pauline Jensen, who died on Tuesday 12 November, will be much missed among her colleagues, our school community and those who knew her beyond our gates. She died peacefully at home, surrounded by friends, in the straw bail house she had built in Goulburn.

Pauline had worked at Balmain Public School for almost ten years; during that time, she was tireless in her efforts to teach and help students. Pauline had a PHD in Boys Education. She was a highly-trained specialist in teaching children with various learning needs. Pauline set up and ran 'Reading Buddies' to help children become fluent readers. She was also trained in the area of intervention for children who were experiencing behaviour difficulties. Pauline set up groups to explicitly teach social skills.

Pauline was very politically active outside school. She was extremely passionate about the environment. To that end, Pauline set up 'Environmental Warriors'. Pauline knew how to give children agency within this large problem, giving them things they could do to help make a difference. In that same vein, Pauline set up the garden at the end of the main building closest to the park.

We look forward to continuing to nurture the legacy of this wonderful teacher. We will miss you.


