Principal's Report

- <u>Apologies & thanks</u> Thank you to Belinda Mikhail Bryant and Annabel Sun for stepping in for me this evening, as I travel to Adelaide for school visits over the next week (their term ends a week later than ours). I'd also like to acknowledge all BPS staff, both teaching and non-teaching, for their support of each other, our students and school, with the different challenges we've been faced with this term. Flexibility has certainly been practised on a daily basis
 - Challenges This term has seen a peak in COVID-related absences at our school, over a number of weeks, ranging anywhere from 10-25%, on a daily basis. With similar statistics across our peninsula, it has been difficult to secure consistent casual teachers to cover staff absences during this time. Our first priority, of course, is to ensure each class has a teacher. There have been occasions where regular programs have been disrupted, as well as an occasional split across the stage cohort, if we've been unable to secure a casual teacher. Our teaching staff have happily stepped in when asked to support our students where possible and the school is grateful for their flexibility
 - <u>Highlights</u> it has been lovely to see our community coming back onsite for our Friday morning awards assemblies, Harmony Day and, in particular, a special Kindy morning and Stage One mornings. Our events are weather-dependent, as we lack suitable indoor/covered spaces. We also continue to follow current advice re ventilation: 'Fresh air is the most effective form of ventilation to minimise risk of transmission. Where there is no natural ventilation, schools will use mechanical ventilation to maximise fresh airflow in learning spaces. Using outdoor spaces will continue to be encouraged</u>. Although the forecast is not promising for Friday, we are determined to go ahead, one way or another, so we can end the term with one of our favourite community events!
- <u>Student Voice & Ms Pauline's Garden</u> As always, our school highly values, and supports where
 possible, student voice. Our Environmental Warriors have individually signed a letter to the Honourable
 Darcy Byrne, Inner West Council mayor and BPS 'old boy'; Jamie Parker MP, local member for Balmain,
 who has also supported students and our school over the years; as well as to Lauren LeChapelle, our P&C
 President. They have been invited to visit our school together for a special morning tea early next term, to
 discuss the possibilities of Ms Pauline's Garden, and how it can be rejuvenated. The students, supported
 by Mrs Felicity Bowman and myself, look forward to meeting with them and hopefully, will have an update
 at the next P&C meeting. Jamie Parker has already RSVPed! In the meantime, we have a design and
 quote from Scully Outdoor Design, who has been engaged with the school for the past few years. We are
 waiting on a second design and quote from Urban Landscape Projects (ULP), who have also designed and
 executed playground spaces for us since 2014. Thankfully, as both companies have worked with us
 previously, there is no design fee involved
- <u>IT Levy</u>: Balance as at 02/03/22 **\$22,279.50. Current balance** as at 06/04/22 **\$40,848** (equates to an additional 218 students that have paid since last month approx. 77% of total students). Our IT Committee have been unable to update 3-year IT plan as yet this year, due to casual relief shortages (as discussed earlier), however, a number of our laptops need to be updated throughout the school. Ms Whelan also requires an IWB for her library lessons. An IT Plan will hopefully be presented/tabled at the next meeting



- **Farewell**: We sadly bid farewell to two of our teaching staff this Friday:
 - Firstly, Belinda Mikhail Bryant, or Mrs MB, as she's known around the school, is accompanying her husband to Queensland for a work promotion. As an Assistant Principal, Belinda has been involved in supporting learning and whole-school programs, during her time at Balmain. Thank you so much for being such an integral member of our school and we wish you the very best of luck for the future. Miss Renae Bonney is the successful candidate, who will replace Belinda until the end of 2022. She commences at the start of Term 2.
 - Or David Carlton has decided to 'spread his wings' and also finishes at the end of this week. Dave is taking up a new opportunity in the corporate world, working with a network of schools and leaders as an Educational Consultant. We value the commitment he has shown during his time at Balmain and we wish him the very best for the future. Ms Lauren Burke, who is currently the Learning and Support teacher at BPS, will be replacing Dave as the classroom teacher.
