Mid this year we held a hugely successful Winter working bee where over 100 parents, friends and children came together to clean up, green up and glean the school and gladstone park.

Will Crutchley and his company Hatch Constructions very generously provided staff, hours and resources to build the decking around the bell tower. Adam Spencer also donated two weekends of his time.
